Dear Parents / Carers

On behalf of The Westbrook Trust may I welcome you all back for the start of another exciting year in school. I would also like to take the opportunity to keep you up-to-date with the activities and successes of the Trust in the past year and our plans for 2018-19. 2017-18

St. Margaret's Infant School embarked on its first full year with the Trust. Once again, the attainment of pupils was above the Medway average and the standards achieved nationally. More children exceed national expectations and results for the Year One Phonics Check remain consistently in the 90% range. The school also received recognition for the work it does to promote high achievement in reading by being asked by The Department of Education to place a bid for funds to help other schools.

Byron Primary School joined the Trust when Ofsted had graded it 'Special Measures'. Year 6 children have made very good progress and achieved above the Medway and national average in all areas. Overall, there was a 26% rise in the number of children achieving the expected standard in all three areas of reading, writing and mathematics. The school successfully bid for funds to the value of £45,000 for school projects and achieved the Bronze UNICEF Rights Respecting School Award.

Brompton-Westbrook Primary School also continued to achieve pupils standards above both Medway and national averages. The school is a Support School National with designation to help other schools to improve. To do this it has a number of staff with special recognition by the Department of Education such as a National Leader of Education, a Local Leader of Education and Specialist Leaders of Education.

The Trust

Overall, the Trust has secured grants in excess of £600,000 both for capital projects to improve school buildings and for school development work. The Trust staff team now includes people who can support the schools with e.g. financial and compliance matters. With help from the Trust's Director of Learning, our schools can focus on the important task of teaching and caring for your children.

2018-19

This year, the Trust will continue to ensure that schools work together to improve educational outcomes for your children. We will implement plans to strengthen governance arrangements and keep a keen eye on finances. We will look specifically at home learning and communications as well as streamlining some administration tasks and carrying out important training with staff and governors.
