#### **Parent Consultation Evenings**

Next week, on 16<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> October we will be hosting our term 1 parent consultation evenings. By now, you will have returned your reply slips to request your preferred time. We had an amazing 83% response rate to request a specific appointment time this term so thanks for that!

These sessions give you a chance to formally meet with your child's class teacher and discuss your child's learning, progress and performance in school. We recommend that you bring your child with you so they can share the discussion and contribute their thoughts and ideas too. As you know, appointments are allocated for 10 minutes and should you require a longer session please call the office who will be able to arrange an alternative appointment time for you.

During these sessions our Senior Leadership Team (Mrs Mason, Mr Presneill and Mrs Price), Inclusion Team (Mrs Prentice, Ms Thomas) and Family Liaison Officer (Mrs Liddle) are also available for any queries, questions or ideas you may have. They are always pleased to catch up and chat so please feel free to join them.

We will also have some Governors available from 5.00 - 5:30pm on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> October should you wish to chat with them.

We are also hoping to have a couple of interactive whiteboards set up to showcase our new website and an exciting new home learning resource called Times Table Rockstars. Times Tables Rock Stars is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice. Each week concentrates on a different times table, with a recommended consolidation week for rehearsing the tables that have recently been practised every third week or so.

This format has very successfully boosted times tables recall speed for hundreds of thousands of pupils over the last 8 years in over 12,000 schools - both primary and secondary - worldwide. We are excited to offer this to support our children with their times tables learning.
