Behaviour Policy

As you know, we are very proud of pupil behaviour in school and regularly get feedback from visitors commenting on how polite, well-behaved and motivated our children are.

Our whole school behaviour policy is published on our website and it operates in conjunction with a number of other policies that we have in school, including our Anti-Bullying, Lunchtimes, SEN, Attendance, Child Protection, E-safety, Complaints and Whistleblowing polices as well as complementing our PSHE work and Rights Respecting School activities. Our policy is reviewed by staff and governors annually and all pupils are taught about the policy and the important role they play in contributing to good behaviour in school.

The policy is based around the following principles that all staff, governors and volunteers believe in and subscribe:

- Develop in children self-discipline and respect, for themselves, others and the environment
- Ensuring pupil safety, prevent bullying and secure academic achievement
- Embrace the view that no behaviour strategies can match the power that strong and positive relationships generated by a caring class teacher can have on pupils
- Have clear expectations and apply discipline consistently and fairly
- Teach good behaviour through the use of good behaviour strategies and by providing good role models
- Create calm with orderly classrooms and transitions
- Provide high quality, regular and timely training for staff
- Understand that challenging behaviour can be managed, but can also be modified or changed

- Understand that supporting children with challenging behaviour is the responsibility of all school staff, their parents and other experts and not just the class teacher
- Have a code of conduct (Fair Charter) with rules, rights and responsibilities clearly stated
- Apply the view that simplicity is key to success
- Manage behaviour positively using system of rewards and consequences
- Provide for pupils' special educational needs so that they are not disadvantaged by gender, race, religion, sexual orientation or disability
- Support the principles through the curriculum and especially by the teaching of PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health & Citizenship Education), RE (Religious Education) and during Collective Worship

We believe in recognition and praise to celebrate success and in clarity and fairness when consequences required. All pupils have the chance to access rewards and every day is a new day.

We will shortly hold an informal workshop to learn more about our behaviour policy. Watch this space for dates and times!

Did you know? The maximum daily
amount of sugar children age 4-6 years
should be consuming is the equivalent
of 5 sugar cubes, and 6 sugar cubes
for children aged 7-10
years. Sometimes this is tricky to stay
on top of, as sugar can be hidden in
pre-packaged snacks.

Download the free **Change4Life Food Scanner** app to your phone or ipad so you can scan the barcode of food items. The app will let you know how many sugar cubes are inside as well as the traffic light nutritional information, helping you to make healthier choices for your children.
