# THE WESTBROOK TRUST Grow Together

We're in the customer vote for a Bags of Help grant from Tesco. It's a scheme which gives community projects like us grants of up to £4,000 – all raised from the sale of carrier bags in Tesco stores. The public will now vote in store during November and December on who should receive the awards. Please support us in your local store!

Our project is called 'Grow Together' and, if successful, will create an inspiring community garden for learning, well-being and food production. Our children highlighted growing food as one of their main interests for the use of the land we have started to develop as part of our wider 'Biodiversity@Brompton' Project. We have already started planting vegetables in a couple of raised beds but we now want to utilise the expertise of local groups to begin a larger, sustainable growing project, helping everyone in our school community to reap the benefits of growing food, eating healthily, outdoor physical activity and strengthened relationships.

The Grow Together project will bring together BWPS families (including those who live in flats without their own garden), along with other local residents and partners. During the school year, the garden will support the children in their learning as well as providing a therapeutic intervention for children facing particular difficulties.

The children will become garden custodians, giving them a sense of responsibility, an understanding of food and sustainability, and of how a community can work together to protect and improve their environment.

Once the garden is fully set up, we will be looking for regular volunteers (parents/grandparents) to help maintain the garden, and assist on events, clubs and activities throughout the year. We will also need some help installing the features of the garden, which will take place during weekend volunteering days.

Remember, voting is taking place now! Please show your support for our project and cast your votes at Tesco throughout November and December.



#### **Nursery parents**
