Road Safety

We have had yet another accident on the roads nearby school in the last week. This time it was a dog that was knocked down by a car. Thankfully the dog was OK but this could easily have been a child and / or easily been much more serious.

Road safety around the school is becoming more and more problematic and as the school grows the issue of road safety around the school becomes more of a cause for concern. In the last 5 years the school roll has grown by 75 pupils as we move from a PAN (Published Admission Number) of 45 children in each year group to 60 children. Currently our PAN is 60 up until Year 4. In the next 2 years the PAN will grow to be 60 in Upper Key Stage 2 which will mean we have another 30 children in school. Unfortunately there is no means of extending parking or changing the road layout so we have to crack this problem before it becomes untenable. The current 'stop and drop' system works reasonably well providing that people DO NOT PARK ON THE ROUNDABOUT or park inconsiderately near to the school gates and entrances. There really is plenty of parking in the MOD roads nearby the school only a few minutes walk away. This also gives you and your child the chance to walk and chat together, meet friends on the way and get some fresh air and exercise. Many parents do this and it has simply become part of their morning routine.

The School Council and the Eco Committee are planning to meet to review the issue and see if they can come up with a plan of action. Whilst we are loath to make any major changes to our current system, there has been previous discussion with the MOD around having restricted access to the roads around the

school if road safety does not improve. Let's make sure that this is not required! The roads around the school belong to the Ministry Of Defence and therefore Medway Council parking enforcement team have no jurisdiction in the local area and will not support our cause. The MOD help as much as they can and PC Helen Binning can often be seen around the school gates when she is available.

On a brighter note, Half Term is fast approaching and Medway Library service are offering a range of magical themed workshops for local families. Please see the attached timetable to see if there is anything you are keen to attend.
