Traffic and Parking (again!) - Walk / Ride to School As you know, the school is getting larger and we have more pupils than ever attending. This is a great thing but also contributes to our twice daily issue of parking and traffic around the school. In the past we have suggested a range of alternative and community-focused measures such as:

- Walking to school
- Riding to school
- Parking 5-10 minutes away and walking the last part of the journey
- Arranging shared lifts with friends and neighbours
- Parking in the nearby area but not directly outside either school gate
- No parking on the roundabout to ensure that your car is not the car that stops traffic flow around the roundabout and therefore congests the drop-off system at the front gate.

You regularly express your concerns about safe driving and parking around the school, which we often share with you through headlines and text messages.

The MOD are concerned about road safety on the estate and would consider putting driving restrictions on the road to ensure that safety improves.

The children have decided that they would like to get their message across to parents about this issue as they feel strongly about it! They were particularly concerned when they found out about a near-miss with a toddler a while back and also that a dog had been hit by a car.

Eco committee reported the following:

'We were really upset to hear that a dog had been hit by a car and very concerned that it could easily have been a child next time.

We have noticed that there seems to be a

big problem with people parking around the roundabout and by the gates to the school causing congestion. Is there some way we can encourage parents to park a distance away and walk up to the school? Can we put some signs up to make drivers more aware of the issues we are experiencing? This is a serious problem and apart from being dangerous it is also not good for the air having so many cars so close to where we wait in the mornings and come out at the end of the day.'

School Council have suggested:

- Only parking on one side of the road
- Parents not allowed to park • outside school, only to drive as far as the Great Lines road
- · Parents not allowed to use the school car park
- Send text reminders
- Cones outside to stop cars stopping and parking
- Lollipop person outside
- More double yellow lines to be put on the road
- Add a large sign about parking at the gates
- Parking bays (if they have to be allowed to drive down to school)
- Children to do gate duty in high vis jackets with signs on posts

The days are getting lighter and the weather is starting to feel more like Spring. What a great time to have a 'Spring clean' of your routines and habits too! We are hoping if the weather improves more children will return to walking/cycling to school again.

The 'drop-off' system works well as long as drivers keep the turning point (roundabout) and roads around clear so that other drivers can literally drop off their children, turn around and leave
